

Conflict Minerals Policy

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN

In the USA, prohibition of the import of conflict minerals is regulated in the Dodd-Frank Act Legislation.

C.C. JENSEN is a supplier to several large companies subject to that law, therefore the Dodd-Frank Act also has an impact on our business. These customers expect that we have traceability in our supply chain regarding tin, tantalum, tungsten and gold sources. Through industry standard due diligence, we are able to show that our material sources of origin are validated mine sources.

C.C. JENSEN strives to import these materials from responsible sources and to identify all material sources of origin for 3TGs.

Each year we at C.C. JENSEN conduct due diligence with our supply chain to verify material sources of origin, then we provide that disclosure to our customers when requested.

We cooperate with Assent Compliance, to ensure supply chain compliance with the Dodd-Frank Act Conflict Minerals Legislation.

On 1 January 2021, a 2017 EU regulation regarding trading of conflict minerals will become fully binding. It requires EU companies that directly import base metals that are then processed into a final product to ensure that they import minerals such as tin, tantalum, tungsten and gold from responsible sources only.

C.C. JENSEN is not a direct importer of raw materials and EU regulation reporting is voluntary for C.C. JENSEN.
